IRS Factsheet “Election Year Activities and the Prohibition on Political Campaign Intervention for Section 501(c)(3) Organizations”

“...section 501 (c) (3) organizations **may** encourage people to participate in the electoral process through **voter registration and get-out-the-vote drives**, conducted in a **non-partisan manner**. On the other hand, voter education or registration activities conducted in a biased manner that **favors (or opposes) one or more candidates is prohibited**”

Don't

- Express **support or opposition** to any candidate or party, including wearing campaign swag
- **Suggest which party** to affiliate with during registration

Do

- **Register anyone** eligible (18+ by election day and a citizen)* and interested regardless of politics

*For federal elections. For local elections, check with your local elections office

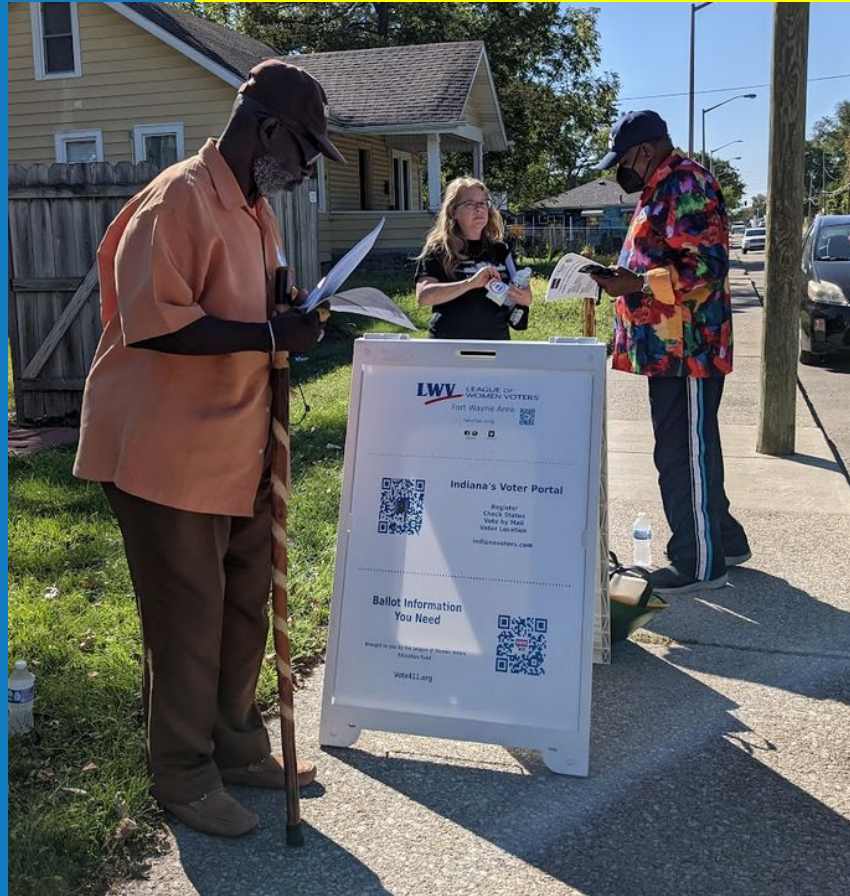
Nonpartisan Voter Reg for Staff & Volunteers

National Voter Reg Day Sign Up Form

As a partner you agree to...

1. Be ***nonpartisan***. We can only work with groups who do not represent a party or candidate.
2. Be ***inclusive***. Anyone who requests a registration form should receive one, regardless of party, beliefs, or other factors.
3. Be ***aware of your state's voter registration laws***. This includes any training requirements and returning completed voter registration forms..
4. Be ***non-transactional***. You cannot give items of value 'in exchange' for a voter registration. Likewise you cannot restrict incentives to only those who register.
5. Have ***fun!*** National Voter Registration Day is a national holiday!

How Can You Do Voter Registration?

Social Media, Email

Use an online voter registration tool

- Easy to start, but lower impact
- Wide potential reach

In-Person Digital

Use an online voter registration tool on phones, tables, computers

- Easier to handle than paper
- Harder for people with no IDs to register online in most states

In-Person Paper

Provide the actual application for people to register
Assist with Delivery to elections office

- Universal way to register anyone
- Harder to manage, more rules

Conducting a Voter Registration Drive in Connecticut

Voter Registration Deadlines

Voter registration applications must be postmarked, received by a voter registration agency, or submitted online by the 7th day before an election (and by the 5th day before a primary). In-person registration for primaries must be completed by noon on the business day before the primary.

Connecticut also allows for Election Day Registration at a designated location in each town.

Conducting a Voter Registration Drive in Pennsylvania

Voter Registration Deadline

Applications must be received by 15 days before Election Day.

Getting Started

Training Requirement: Pennsylvania does not require training for registration drives.

Notification and Registration Requirements: Pennsylvania does not have notification requirements for registration drives.

Compensation Restrictions: It is illegal to pay registration drive participants based on how many registrations they collect.

Obtaining Applications

State Form: Voter registration applications may be obtained from the [Secretary of State's website](#). Pennsylvania application forms are available for free through the Department of State. To request copies of the Voter Registration Application email ST-VOTERREG@pa.gov or call 1-877-868-3772. Be sure to include the number of voter registration forms you want.

Federal Form: Voter registration organizations are asked to use Pennsylvania specific application forms, but may also use the [federal voter registration application](#).

Web API: Pennsylvania's online voter registration [system](#) accepts applications from voters who can provide an electronic signature, even if they do not have a driver's license. The state has developed a WebAPI for organizations, who must register with the Department of State's Bureau of Commissions, Elections and Legislation in order to use it at <https://paovrwebapi.votepa.com/SUREWebAPIAdmin/>. More information is available [here](#).

Photocopying Blank Forms: Blank applications may be photocopied and used in voter registration drives, but printed forms must meet paper quality standards set by the Secretary of State's office.

Handling Applications

Incomplete Applications: Do not fill in any missing information on a registration application without the permission from the applicant. Any person who assists in the completion of a registration application must sign the application and indicate the person's address.

Photocopying Completed Applications: As a best practice, a voter's full or partial Social Security number and/or driver's license number should not be copied.

Submitting Completed Applications: Completed voter registration applications should be submitted to the voter's [County Voter Registration Office](#).

The Secretary of State recommends that voter registration organizations submit completed applications as they are received.

Conducting a Voter Registration Drive in Minnesota

Voter Registration Deadlines

- Registration applications must be received by 5 p.m. on the 21st day before Election Day.
- Online registrations may be received through the [Secretary of State's website](#) no later than 11:59 p.m. on the 21st day before Election Day.
- Third parties may not electronically submit a voter registration application on behalf of another individual; however, they may help a voter submit an online application as long as it is done with the voter's consent and in the voter's presence.
- A specific turnaround time applies to voter registration drives turning in applications they collect. See below.
- Minnesota has Election Day registration as well.

Getting Started

Training Requirement: Minnesota does not have training for registration drives.

Notification and Registration Requirements: Minnesota does not have notification requirements for registration drives.

Compensation Restrictions: It is illegal to pay registration drive participants based on how many registrations they collect.

Obtaining Applications

State Form: Contact a [county auditor](#) or the secretary of state, or download forms from the [secretary of state's website](#). The county auditor is required to provide voter registration applications to any person or group who requests a reasonable number of applications for the purpose of distribution.

Federal Form: The [federal mail-in voter registration application](#) may be used in voter registration drives.

Photocopying Blank Forms: Blank applications may be photocopyed and used in voter registration drives.

Handling Applications

Incomplete Applications: Voter registration drives are encouraged to assist people with completing applications, but pre-filled forms may not be used. Do not fill in any missing information on a registration form unless you have permission from the applicant.

Check “Handling Applications - Incomplete Applications” for how to handle missing info on forms

Some states have laws around or require:

- Signature when providing assistance
- Prohibit writing missing info in for voters
- Voters to receive a “Receipt”

Handling Forms: Texas Example

Receipts: Fill out a receipt for each applicant, and give the receipt to the applicant and the duplicate receipt to the voter registrar when the application is delivered. VDRs are advised to keep a copy for their records. The Secretary of State recommends that volunteer deputy registrars retain their receipt books for the 22 months following the election closest to the applications' effective date.

Voter Registration Deadlines

- Registration applications must be received by 5 p.m. on the 21st day before Election Day.
- Online registrations may be received through the [Secretary of State's website](#) no later than 11:59 p.m. on the 21st day before Election Day.
- Third parties may not electronically submit a voter registration application on behalf of another individual; however, they may help a voter submit an online application as long as it is done with the voter's consent and in the voter's presence.
- A specific turnaround time applies to voter registration drives turning in applications they collect. See below.
- Minnesota has Election Day registration as well.

Getting Started

Training Requirement: Minnesota does not require training for registration drives.

Notification and Registration Requirements: Minnesota does not have notification requirements for registration drives.

Compensation Restrictions: It is illegal to pay registration drive participants based on how many registrations they collect.

Obtaining Applications

State Form: Contact a [county auditor](#) or the secretary of state, or download forms from the [secretary of state's website](#). The county auditor is required to provide voter registration applications to any person or group who requests a reasonable number of applications for the purpose of distribution.

Federal Form: The [federal mail-in voter registration application](#) may be used in voter registration drives.

Photocopying Blank Forms: Blank applications may be photocopied and used in voter registration drives.

Handling Applications

Incomplete Applications: Voter registration volunteers are encouraged to assist people with completing applications, but pre-filled forms may not be used. Do not fill in any missing information on a registration form unless you have permission from the applicant.

Completing & Returning Forms: Massachusetts Example

Submitting Completed Applications: A completed voter registration form shall be mailed, transmitted, or otherwise delivered within 5 calendar days of completion or by the registration deadline, whichever is earlier, to the board of registrars of the city or town in which the registration applicant resides.



Conducting a Voter Registration Drive in Massachusetts

Voter Registration Deadline

Applications must be received or postmarked by the 20th day before Election Day. If the final day for registration of voters falls on Sunday or a holiday, the preceding day is the final day for such registration.

A specific turnaround time applies to voter registration drives turning in applications they collect.
See below.

Getting Started

Training Requirement: Massachusetts does not require training for registration drives.

Notification and Registration Requirements: Massachusetts does not have notification requirements for registration drives. The Secretary of State's office recommends checking with the local police department as each city and town may have different requirements for such solicitation.

Compensation Restrictions: Do not pay registration drive participants based on how many registrations they collect.

Obtaining Applications

State Form: The state registration application may be obtained by contacting the Secretary of State's Elections Division at 800-462-VOTE (8683) or 617-727-2828 or by on [the Secretary of State's website](#).

Handling Applications

Complete Applications: There is no law or rule prohibiting photocopying or retaining information from completed registration applications. As a best practice, a voter's full or partial Social Security number and/or driver's license number should not be retained.

Photocopying Completed Applications: Massachusetts law contains no prohibitions against photocopying completed registration applications. However, be sure to only submit ORIGINAL completed forms with the ORIGINAL signature; a photocopied form will not be accepted.

Submitting Completed Applications: A completed voter registration form shall be mailed, transmitted, or otherwise delivered within 5 calendar days of completion or by the registration deadline, whichever is earlier, to the board of registrars of the city or town in which the registration applicant resides.

- Keep it **nonpartisan** to reach more voters!

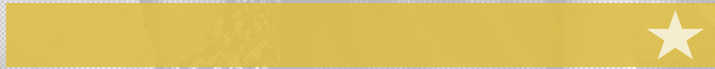

Are YOU registered?

- **Expectations for each shift:**
 - Is this a regular VR site where voters expect to see you?
 - Is this a population that certainly needs VR
- **More education than registration:**
 - Assume everyone needs the latest election rules, dates
 - Assume most are eligible and registered
- **Intro lines:**
 - Have you moved since you last voted?
 - Have you checked out your sample ballot?



Keys to Success

- **Know the local voting rules! Sometime rules changed since 2020 and some voters will be going off old info**
- **Know your Election Day and how to find sample ballot- you'll hear about how do I find WHO**
- **Phone a Friend- don't accidentally share misinformation or increase the myth of voter apathy**
- **Share your experience! Voters can share with friends and family that they registered today (everyone loves a sticker)**



Best Practices

- **Communication approach**
 - **Active tabling**
- **Brush off any uninterested or hurried voter who won't engage**
- **Supportive not Shameful**
 - **Meet voters where they are, not everyone has to be thrilled to vote!**
