



## Conducting a Voter Registration Drive in Vermont

### Voter Registration Deadline

Voter registration forms may be submitted to a town clerk any day other than the day of an Election. Note: voters may also submit a voter registration form on Election Day at their polling place.

**A specific turnaround time applies to voter registration drives submitting applications they collect.**

#### Getting Started

**Training Requirement:** Vermont does not require training for registration drives.

**Notification and Registration Requirements:** Vermont does not have notification requirements for registration drives.

**Compensation Restrictions:** Do not pay registration drive participants based on how many registrations they collect. Do not offer an applicant any incentive of monetary value to register to vote.

#### Obtaining Applications

**State Form:** Download and print the form from the [Secretary of State's website](#). Call 1-800-439-VOTE or email [voterreg@sec.state.vt.us](mailto:voterreg@sec.state.vt.us) or go to <https://sos.vermont.gov/elections/voters/registration/> to order voter registration forms, or contact your local town clerk.

**Federal Form:** The [federal mail-in voter registration application](#) may be used in voter registration drives.

**Photocopying Blank Forms:** Blank applications may be photocopied and used in voter registration drives.

#### Handling Applications

**Incomplete Applications:** Do not fill in any missing information on a registration form unless you have permission from the applicant.

**Photocopying Completed Applications:** As a best practice, a voter's full or partial Social Security number and/or driver's license number should not be retained.

**Submitting Completed Applications:** Completed voter registration forms must be submitted to the appropriate town clerk within seven days of acceptance or before the day of the next election, whichever is sooner.
