NATIONAL VOTER REGISTRATION DAY 2024 CELEBRATES

2 MILLION

NEW VOTER REGISTRATIONS, UPDATES, AND STATUS VERIFICATIONS

- Two million Americans registered, updated their registration, or checked/verified their registration status as part of the holiday. This represents **1 out of every 120 eligible voters** nationwide.
- Of this number, **820,000 voters** registered to vote or updated their voter registration status as part of the day, and **310,000** of the registrations were from youth voters (18-24 year olds)
 - Over a quarter **(230,000)** of the new and updated registrations were collected by community partners at events across the nation, with each event collecting 50 registrations on average.
- This now brings the holiday's lifetime registration total to over **six million voters**, underscoring the importance of the annual celebration in keeping the democratic process accessible and inclusive.

5 steps for preparing voters for their experience at the polls



Why prep voters in advance for what they'll expect?

This year, we will see elections for **34** US Senate seats, **435** House of Representatives seats, state legislative races across **44 states**, and **11** governors races, alongside scores of municipal races and ballot initiatives.

Millions of Americans

will face a new landscape of voting laws passed in their states in the wake of the 2020 federal election.

8 million+

youth have reached voting age since the 2022 midterms.



Step 1: Get your pre-Election Day education

See a breakdown of how voting at home works in each state: Policies, Returning forms, third party rules, and ballot curing.

Learn where candidates running for office in your community stand on the issues. Only candidates that appear on your ballot, based on the address you enter, will be listed. Read through nonpartisan voters guides that show where candidates stand. They're produced by veteran journalists with links to credible sources. Available online and in printable versions.





Step 2: Confirm your details and review your ballot

There are many reasons to check your details before heading to the polls including confirming that you're **still in voting rolls, verifying that your poll site hasn't changed, and checking what party** you're registered to.

Now that you've confirmed your status, review your ballot (positions) and research candidates so you know who you're voting for.

Step 3: Make a plan

Once you've confirmed your status, poll site and ballot information, research how you **plan to vote** based on your state guidelines. Find out where you can vote in person, what voting machines are used, and what you need to bring with you on Election Day by entering your address <u>here</u>.





Step 4: Pre-pack appropriate documents to bring to the polls

You'll hear in a minute from VoteRiders about **voter ID requirements across the country**, but make sure you have your appropriate identification docs with you before you go out to vote.

If it's helpful, print out a sample ballot from your state's election website (if available) so you have an easy list of the candidates you're planning to vote for!





Step 5: Go VOTE and make your voice heard!





What is early voting?

- Early voting taking advantage of your opportunities to vote ahead of Election Day (Nov 5)
 - Mail
 - In-Person



Why Vote Early?

- When Americans wait they run into problems
- Voting early ensure you can overcome these obstacles

When you vote early...

You skip long polling place lines

Last-minute meetings or emergencies on Election Day don't pull you away from casting your ballot



You can overcome the hurdles caused by voter disinformation

You have time and opportunities to conquer the obstacle of often confusing election rules

What to expect when you are voting early?

- In person
 - Very similar to the process on Election Day
 - Show up at a time that is convenient for you and your schedule
 - Generally quicker than Election Day voting
- By mail
 - You mail ballot will be delivered directly to your door
 - You can take the time you need to learn about candidates and issues at your leisure
 - You can share the experience with family and friends (if you want)
 - \circ $\;$ You can mail it back or drop it off

Ride to the Polls



Uber is offering riders **50% off your ride to your poll site** (up to \$10) across the US including Washington DC and Puerto Rico. California and Georgia will be excluded from this offer.

They're also offering eaters **25% off their orders** (up to \$15, \$25 min order) starting at 6PM local time to watch election night results across the US.

There is **no promo code**; all voters will go into the Uber app and **click the "Go Vote" icon**, enter your voting address. And you can pick whatever mode of on-demand transportations you want -- from an UberX to a Lime Bike to an Uber Black. The discount is automatically applied for the trip to your polling location!
