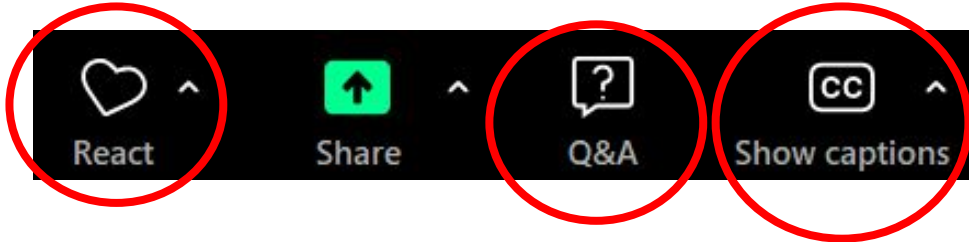

- Since 2012, National Voter Registration Day and its partners have helped register over 6 million voters.
- In 2024 alone, 820,000 people registered or updated their registration—1 in every 120 eligible voters nationwide.
- Thousands of diverse partners participate annually, supported by national endorsements and free tools for digital and in-person outreach.
- The holiday is endorsed by the National Association of Secretaries of State (**NASS**), the National Association of State Election Directors (**NASED**), the U.S. Election Assistance Commission (**EAC**), and the National Association of Election Officials (**The Election Center**).

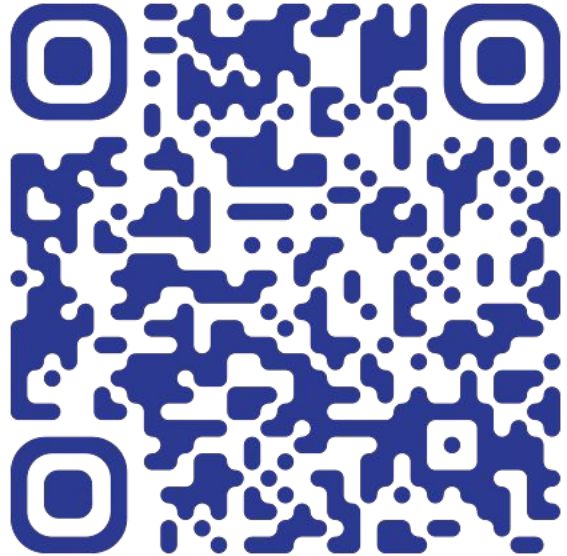
1. Be **nonpartisan**.

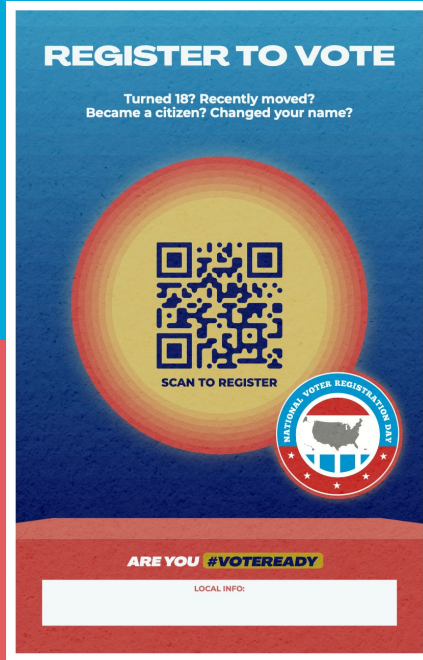
# What you can do as a **community partner**

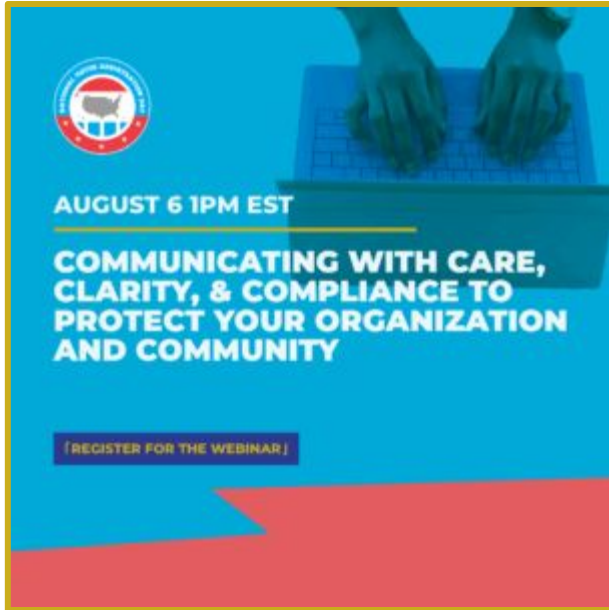

**Sieng Lee** is the National Field Director at Asian and Pacific Islander American Vote (APIAVote), where he leads national efforts to engage, educate, and empower AAPI communities in civic participation. Prior to APIAVote, he was a highly effective campaign manager and field strategist in Minnesota, helping elect nine BIPOC leaders, including several historic firsts for AAPI and African American candidates. A Hmong American refugee who came to the U.S. in 1991, Sieng is widely recognized for his work advancing representation and building political power in underrepresented communities.

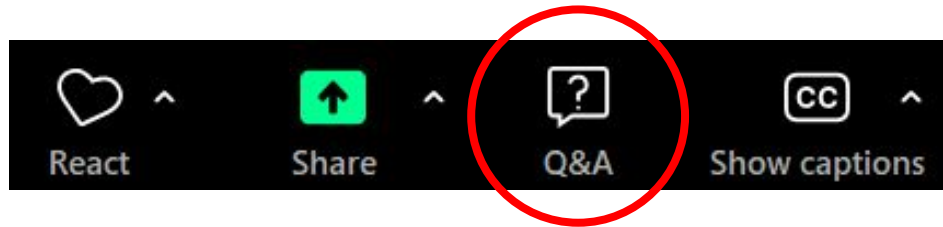


**Yadira Sanchez**

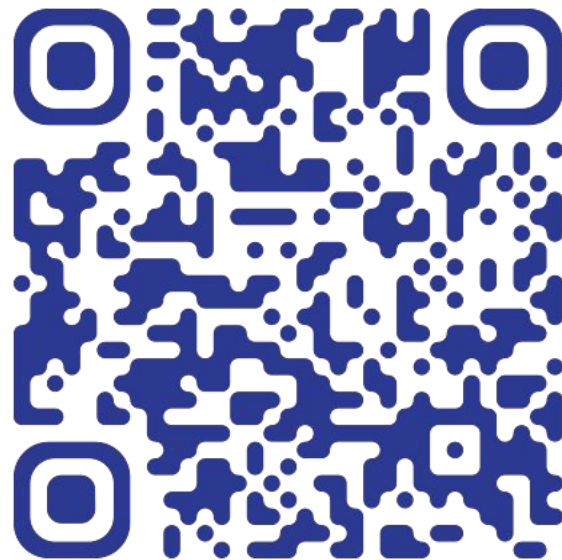

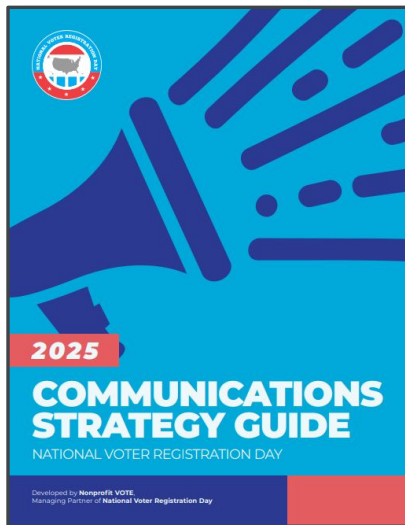

Applications to register before Election Day must be received by the day of the local election officials' last check-list meeting, which occurs 6-13 days before Election Day. Check with your local clerk for the exact date.</li> </ul> <p><b>HOW TO REGISTER TO VOTE IN NEW HAMPSHIRE</b></p> <p><b>There are three ways to register to vote in New Hampshire:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li><b>Register in person at your town or city clerk's office.</b></li> <li><b>Register in person with your community's Supervisors of the Checklist.</b> By law, the Supervisors of the Checklist are required to meet on a day 6-13 days prior to each election. Check the local newspaper or call your clerk's office for the date and time of such meeting.</li> <li><b>Register at your polling place on Election Day.</b> All voters must show proof of identity, age, citizenship, and domicile, which must be satisfied with documents.</li> </ul> <p>See the following for the state's guide to voter registration: <a href="http://voters.nh.gov">voters.nh.gov</a></p> <p>An individual is eligible to vote if they are:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>All at least 18 years old by Election Day</li> <li>A U.S. citizen</li> <li>Domiciled in the city or town where the person is registering to vote (there is no minimum period of time required to have lived in the state to establish domicile for voter registration).</li> </ul> <p>Proof can be satisfied in the following ways:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>A driver's license or non-driver ID from any state</li> <li>A birth certificate, U.S. Passport card, or naturalization document satisfies proof of citizenship.</li> <li>Proof of Domicile:             <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>If you have it you must provide one ID card issued by New Hampshire DMV showing your current domicile address.</li> <li>New Hampshire resident vehicle registration address on your voter registration form</li> <li>Photo ID issued by the US government that contains a current address.</li> <li>Government issued check, benefit statement, or tax document with a current address.</li> </ul> </li> </ul> <p><b>OBTAINING APPLICATIONS</b></p> <p>Applications to register to vote must be obtained from the town or city clerk's office.</p> <p>Please note that New Hampshire town and city clerks will only accept the federal form as a request for the state's absentee voter mail-in registration form. Find the federal form here: <a href="http://www.elections.nh.gov/voter-registration">www.elections.nh.gov/voter-registration</a></p> <p>The New Hampshire absentee voter mail-in registration form must be received by the city or town clerk by 10 days before the election.</p> <p><small>Fair Elections Center, its Campus Vote Project, and Nonprofit VOTE are 501(c)(3) nonprofit organizations and are not affiliated with any government agency. 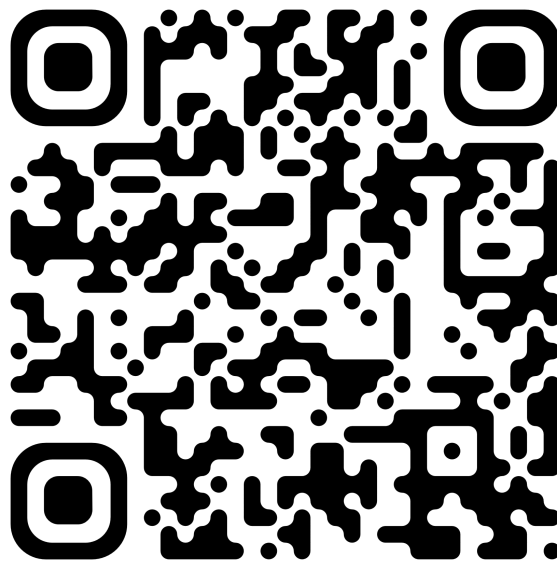
